### **Brian Buck Travellers Tales**

**73. (13,085) Friday 13<sup>th</sup> September 2019. Shefford Town & Campton Reserves 0 Riseley Sports 6 (Bedfordshire County League Premier Division) (7.45pm kick off) att 60 approx.** Between the previous game and this one I became quite ill and as I write, six days later I am yet to fully recover. It had been very hot at the previous game and I reckon that as I went to it straight from breakfast, I put no liquid inside me for something like six hours, thus making me become dehydrated. Having food and maybe three cups of tea before I went out again only served to compound the problem and thus on my way to this game I was forced to inspect a hedge! So, by the time we arrived at the ground I wasn't in a good way. For a while I stood and sat in the stand they have here these days and this offers a good view. Anyway, this wasn't to be a good night for the hosts and on 25 minutes they conceded their first goal, by way of a 20 yard deflected shot. On 34 minutes a second goal followed, this time from the spot, following a handball and the third one came on 39 minutes, but by now I was sitting at one of the tables in front of the club bar. I had aches and pains all over my body, particularly around my midriff. Trouble was that my view of the pitch was partially blocked by the bar of the perimeter fencing and for the remainder of the game neither could I see much, but equally I wasn't really interested in the game. In truth I really just wanted to get home. Riseley added further goals on 59, 82 and 90 minutes and to me they looked a very useful, well organised side. Shefford meanwhile seemed to work hard, but this is a big step for them having replaced their first team in this division this season and I would suggest that they were not quite as bad as the scoreline tonight suggested.

### **Wednesday 25<sup>th</sup> September 2019.**

In their final warm-up game before facing the Staffordshire County Senior League in a first round FA Inter-League Cup tie in 10 days time the Bedfordshire County League netted a 4-1 victory over Shefford Town & Campton under their Hitchin Road floodlights. Taking the lead in the 36<sup>th</sup> minute via Tim Akerele ( Crawley Green Reserves ) it was made 2-0 just 120 seconds later by Zac Ives ( AFC Oakley ) and the game in effect settled as a contest when Akerele netted his second of the evening 10 minutes into the second half. With the game now in time added on Antonio Ricciardi ( Cranfield United ) made it 4-0 before with the very last kick off the match Henry Snee for the home side reduced the arrears to 4-1.

### **Division One**

Cranfield United Reserves remain 100% for the season and two points clear at the head of the Division One standings after winning 4-2 at Houghton Athletic. Joseph Bygraves with a brace joined on the United scoresheet by strikes from Jack Brown and Patrick Lawrence against home replies via Leroy White and Josh Burnett. Remaining in second place and retaining their seasons unbeaten ways are Henlow the 3-0 home winners over Ampthill Town Development thanks to a hat-trick from Cameron Care.
