Registration Forms (covered under league rule 8)

All registrations are now conducted in Whole Game via each individual clubs Team Administrators and likewise all transfers.

With regard to transfers please note the league will not approve any transfers under the waived banner until the leaving club have notified the league they are happy for the transfer to go ahead.

Teamsheet Notes

Please note the names of your players must show both forenames and family names and the number of the shirt each player is going to wear in the game.

Far too many clubs in the past couple of seasons failed to display the correct number shirt against their players, please ensure this does not happen again in season 2021-22.

This season, all match officials are being instructed to refuse any sheet not completed in this manner.

Please note the exchange of team sheets should take place at least 15 minutes prior to kick off in presence of the Match Day Referee.

Result Sheets

Please note the deadline for your entry onto the Full Time Website is within 3 days of the match.

Thus the deadline is Tuesday Midnight following any given Saturday game. **(in the now digital world this has been brought forward 24 hours)**

For Monday games it would be the Thursday Midnight following and for Wednesday games it's the Saturday Midnight following.

Please ensure you spend a minute or so checking your entry as in each of every weekend last season at least one club and often up to six clubs had omitted to submit a referee mark.

Please note all result sheets are to be retained for possible inspection during the course of the season.

Match Day Reporting of Result (covered under league rule 11B)

The deadline for this to happen is within one hour of the match finishing. To clarify the actual time the league regards this to be three hours from the scheduled kick off time.

If 2pm Kick Off then its 5pm. If 2.30 pm Kick off then its 5.30pm. An additional 15 minutes will be allowed when involved in County Cup/ League Cup Tie that go to a penalty shoot-out.

Please remember if you are the away side in any County Cup Tie against opponents from outside our league then your club becomes responsible for reporting the result as above. Otherwise it's just the home side.

The preferred method is by text to 07779680269 – otherwise a phone call to the same number is quite acceptable – **please refrain from leaving messages on the answer phone**, if the line is busy then please wait a few moments and redial or send a text.

Match Day information required for Press Reports etc.

When reporting the above result please provide the name of your goalscorers and any additional information such as sequence of the scoreline, time of goals, red cards, penalty misses/saves or anything unusual of note.

It would also very much assist if when you are the away team that the same information is supplied.

47th game of the season. (Match 13,428) Wednesday 1st September 2021. Clifton 1 Henlow 2 (Friendly Match) att 20 approx. Tonight was a cloudy and unseasonably cold evening, so it was on with the coat for this derby match between neighbouring villages. You can walk quite easily between the two grounds, but not perhaps if you have had a couple of pints or so in the renowned *Engineer* pub in Henlow beforehand! So it was that the ref decided wisely, as it turned out, to play the game over two 40 minute periods (approx!) It wasn't the most exciting match I'll see this season but both sides gave it a go in what would be their last friendly match before the competitive stuff

started on the following Saturday. Division 2 side Clifton had the better of the early exchanges when their lively number 10 took full advantage of some indecision in the Division 1 Henlow defence on 8 minutes, ramming the ball home from about 10 yards out. Gradually though, Henlow got themselves into the match and on 37 minutes a long lob beat the keeper before being helped over the line by a defender trying to keep the ball out. At the break we got talking to a couple who came to watch their two sons play, one for either side, but later on the genial lady started cheering for Henlow asked her, "Why are you cheering for Henlow when we live in Clifton?" The answer was that their son playing for Henlow had been subbed while the other one was still on the pitch. As the evening grew darker quickly, not helped by some funny coloured smoke and smells coming from the occupants in the nearby play area, Henlow won the match with a very late spot kick, given for handball and rightly so according to the Clifton manager.

Premier Division supported by Sportsform

Queens Park Crescents remain at the head of the Premier Division standings on goal difference following their 3-0 away win at Shefford Town & Campton Reserves thanks to a brace of goals from Shahinur Rahman and a strike from Daniel Rasol. Whilst second place Stevington also netted their fourth win on the bounce 1-0 at home to Riseley Sports with a goal from Louis Green.

Just two points behind in third spot and still unbeaten this season are AFC Oakley who won 6-2 at home against Caldecote. Bedfordshire FA Intermediate Cup Second Round

There were to be walk over wins for Totternhoe Reserves at AFC Bedford United and for St Joseph (Saturday) at home to Soccerlise, whilst covid 19 issues prevented Ickwell & Old Warden making the journey to face Sporting Lewsey Park. On the field of play the lone away win of the afternoon saw The 61 FC Luton Reserves with goals from Nana Boffiah and Josh Scrutton win 2-1 at Brache Phoenix whose reply came from Akeem Barbour.

The biggest home winners were Wilstead with a 5-3 victory over AFC Kempston Town & Bedford College Reserves. Luke Pursey netting four times and Max Natola once against Town replies from Eddy Mapfirakupa, Brad Moore and Connor Butterworth. Whilst Clifton with goals from James Bell twice plus Liam Phillips and Alec Duncan beat Wootton Blue Cross 4-2. Whose pair in reply both came from Joe Bygraves.

Also netting four at home were Flitwick Town Reserves to beat Harlington Juniors 4-1. Pete Rogan with a brace plus goals from Dale Goldie and Luke Finney only being replied to once by Ben Middleton. Whilst Barton Rovers Reserves were the 3-1 home victors over Cranfield United Reserves.
