Teamsheet Notes

Please note the names of your players must show both forenames and family names and the number of the shirt each player is going to wear in the game.

Far too many clubs in the past couple of seasons failed to display the correct number shirt against their players, please ensure this does not happen again in season 2021-22.

This season, all match officials are being instructed to refuse any sheet not completed in this manner.

Please note the exchange of team sheets should take place at least 15 minutes prior to kick off in presence of the Match Day Referee.

Result Sheets

Please note the deadline for your entry onto the Full Time Website is within 3 days of the match.

Thus the deadline is Tuesday Midnight following any given Saturday game. **(in the now digital world this has been brought forward 24 hours)**

For Monday games it would be the Thursday Midnight following and for Wednesday games it's the Saturday Midnight following.

Please ensure you spend a minute or so checking your entry as in each of every weekend last season at least one club and often up to six clubs had omitted to submit a referee mark.

Please note all result sheets are to be retained for possible inspection during the course of the season.

Match Day Reporting of Result (covered under league rule 11B)

The deadline for this to happen is within one hour of the match finishing. To clarify the actual time the league regards this to be three hours from the scheduled kick off time.

If 2pm Kick Off then its 5pm. If 2.30 pm Kick off then its 5.30pm. An additional 15 minutes will be allowed when involved in County Cup/ League Cup Tie that go to a penalty shoot-out.

Please remember if you are the away side in any County Cup Tie against opponents from outside our league then your club becomes responsible for reporting the result as above. Otherwise it's just the home side.

The preferred method is by text to 07779680269 – otherwise a phone call to the same number is quite acceptable – **please refrain from leaving messages on the answer phone**, if the line is busy then please wait a few moments and redial or send a text.

Match Day information required for Press Reports etc.

When reporting the above result please provide the name of your goalscorers and any additional information such as sequence of the scoreline, time of goals, red cards, penalty misses/saves or anything unusual of note.

It would also very much assist if when you are the away team that the same information is supplied.

Postponed Games due to Unfit Pitches from January 1st 2022

Clubs are reminded that under league rules that should your home pitch be unplayable due to adverse weather it's mandatory to switch the fixture to that of your opponents or a neutral ground if such a pitch is available.

Any club failing to comply will be deemed to not have fulfilled the fixture and dealt with under league rule 20E

Brian Buck Travellers Tales

213. (13,594) Friday 1st April 2022. Wootton Blue Cross U23 0 Wootton Blue Cross Reserves 0 (Wootton Blue Cross Reserves won 4-3 on penalties) Bedfordshire County League Watson Shield 1st Round) att 110 approx. By a rather strange coincidence these sides were drawn to play each other and as their first team was at home next day and the club not wanting to play at the U23's usual venue, namely Wootton Recreation Ground, across the road, it was decided to play this game at Weston Park tonight instead, despite the concern that bar takings might drop because most of the usual contributors were playing this evening. But that concern soon evaporated when seemingly just about the whole village turned up to watch. But on a pitch covered in daisies we didn't see a great game. It was almost like the players were paying more attention to not treading on the flowers than trying to score. Both sides had a few shots in the first half, but on a night which became increasingly cold, they never seriously looked like scoring. There was a bit of passion in the game for a while though and a dodgy tackle on 37 minutes, which led to the games only booking, sent blood pressures rising for a short while. During this period it seemed that the resses didn't particularly like being given the runaround by their younger counterparts. In the second half everything calmed down though, goal attempts were fewer and at times you wondered just how these sides were top of their respective divisions. By the end, no one had scored and so we moved onto spot kicks, taken at the end where housing was furthest away from the pitch, for obvious reasons. Out of the ten kicks required the U23's missed their first and fifth shots, whilst the Reserves only missed their second shot, thus securing for themselves a place in the next round. Not the most exciting of evenings here!

216. (13,597) Tuesday 5th April 2022. Biggleswade United U23 2 Queens Park Crescents 3 (Bedfordshire County League Premier Division) att 50 approx. Tonight the kick off time was put back by five minutes to 7.50pm to allow for Crescents to complete their Ramadan fasting break. United U23's are rather surprisingly bottom of this league and until recently, without a home league win this season. But I've seen them play a number of times here and I can honestly say that they don't play like a bottom of the table side to me. Tonight was another one of those evenings and in a match which the keepers of both sides had little to do it was rather surprising that the game yielded five goals. The first of these arrived on 35 minutes and was hammered home by a Crescents player from an acute angle from about 15 yards out. Up until this point they had been mainly on top, but the goal saw United up their game immediately. The second half found the visiting lino in action on our side of the pitch and he came under close scrutinisation by some of the home faithful each time he raised his flag. This examination was soon extended to the ref, who was being observed tonight and after a brief chat, the aforementioned lino's interpretation of the offside laws gradually improved. On 51 minutes the visitors doubled their lead. But with the game seemingly over United pulled a goal back with a goal smashed home from about 25 yards out, from somewhere not far from the corner of the area. But two minutes later a shove in the area saw Crescents regain their two goal advantage from the spot. Then on 81 minutes United were awarded their own spot kick, given for a slightly debatable handball. Thereafter they pushed hard for the equaliser, which simply wouldn't come, to bring to a close one of the better games I had seen in recent weeks.

217. (13,598) Wednesday 6th April 2022. Biggleswade Reserves 10 Riseley Sports 0 (Bedfordshire County League Premier Division) (Played at Caldecote) (6.15pm kick off) att 40 approx. Two games tonight on this windy evening and the first of these was played out on the back pitch at Caldecote, which is a tad more enclosed than the main pitch, which is in front of the clubhouse and is shared with the cricket. We stood on the 'hedge' side, which meant that we were sheltered from most of the strong wind. Usually everyone stands on the clubhouse side here, leaving us free to watch the match in peace and quiet, but tonight everyone had the same idea, for the same reasons and as such it was a bit difficult to find some space to watch the match from. Having said that this was an idiot free night and there were no jack the lads around. Anyway I doubt if these two sides have any following them anyway. A home win was expected tonight. Biggleswade are one of a number of clubs who can still win this league whilst Riseley are fighting relegation, although they have a number of games in hand over their rivals. But in this 40 minutes each way affair this was not to be their night. After the hosts opened the scoring on 8 minutes they doubled their lead on 27 minutes from the spot, following a foul, which some considered took place just outside the area. Then on the stroke of half time the score became 3-0 when the ball was forced home following a cross from the byline. If it wasn't game over by then, it certainly was three minutes into the restart when the fourth one went in and a minute later when the visiting keeper couldn't hold on to a shot. Thereafter goals went in every few minutes and it was only as we moved round to the clubhouse side, ready to make a quick getaway, that we realised just how windy it was. I did feel a bit sorry for Riseley. Biggleswade had some players in their side who had the ability to play at a much higher level, whilst they, one of the most northerly sides in the league had to come here midweek. To their credit they fulfilled the fixture without any complaints in this largely friction free game. I don't suppose they enjoyed getting thrashed one bit, but they just got on with it, despite not having a proper shot all evening.

218. (13,599) Wednesday 6th April 2022. Shefford Town & Campton U23 0 Sandy 3 (Bedfordshire County League Division 3) (7.45pm kick off) att 55 approx. After the previous match had finished, we jumped in the car and headed off towards Langford to see their match against Ampthill Town, but for some strange reason, probably because we were on the Shefford road, we changed our minds and headed off there instead. On our arrival we found that we had only missed a few minutes and just as importantly, we hadn't missed any goals. Unfortunately though, at this point all the best seats in the stand were taken and so we had to sit in the front seats. We were already cold from watching the first game and so this didn't help. We'd seen Sandy's last away game, when they lost 5-1 at Wootton Blue Cross Reserves a few Friday night's back and as they are bottom of this division, after the withdrawal of Marston Shelton Rovers Reserves, not much was expected from them, even though Shefford were only a few places above them. But they were well supported tonight and that was also something of a surprise! With the wind still very much a key factor in this game it was Sandy who took the lead with about 20 minutes played. The goal arrived unexpectedly and the shot was hit with power from about 50 yards out. I think that it might have hit the woodwork before it went in, but had it hit the keeper on its way then I think that it might have taken him over the line on its way! In a game of few goal attempts it was Sandy who scored the next goal as well. This time it was a suddenly

hit shot from about 25 yards out, which kept low, but again the speed of the shot deceived the keeper. Time then for a most welcome hot drink, which warmed us up. Further good news arrived when we finally bagged some back row seats in the stand. In this period Shefford started well and the older looking Sandy seemed to fade. But the visitors got a second wind and in added on time they bagged a third goal to give them their first away win of the season and as such they didn't look like a bottom of the table side.

Tuesday 5th April 2022

Shefford Town & Campton Reserves will now face a May Bank Holiday Monday Britannia Cup Final encounter with Biggleswade FC Reserves following their Semi-final 2-0 victory over Flitwick Town thanks to goals from Harry Lovely and Telmo Dis Santos Jesus. Whilst Premier Division supported by Sportsform action saw Queens Park Crescents end a five game losing away run by winning 3-2 at Biggleswade United Under23's. Fabio Sattar giving them a 35th minute lead before Imuentinyan Godwin doubled their lead 10 minutes into the second half. United looking far from a bottom of the table side were back into the game on 70 minutes when Tyler Smith sent one flying in from some 25 yards out. However their lead was to last just two minutes before from the penalty spot Ciaran McEvoy restored the Crescents two goal lead. United were far from accepting defeat and given a lifeline when nine minutes from time Charisma Agyemang slotted home from the penalty spot to reduce the arrears to a single goal. A frantic closing minutes saw the Crescents hold onto their lead to deny the United a deserved share of the spoils their performance warranted.

Division Five action saw league leaders Wootton Blue Cross U23's require a 90th minute goal direct from a corner by Jacob Griffiths to extend their unbeaten ways up to 11 games when held to a 1-1 home draw by Clifton Reserves who had taken the lead just two minutes into the contest with a goal from Luke Rowe.

Elstow Abbey were to lose their place at the head of the Premier Division supported by Sportsform standing after being held to a 3-3 draw at third place Biggleswade FC Reserves.
