### **Brian Buck Travellers Tales**

**26. (13,285) Tuesday 8<sup>th</sup> September 2020. Biggleswade United U23 5 Wormley Rovers Reserves 0 (Friendly Match) att 65 approx.** I was going to watch a competitive match tonight, but eventually picked out this game as I knew that here I could sit down and watch the match with a clear uninterrupted view of the pitch. As has become the norm at these types of grounds, on our arrival there was a Track & Trace system in operation, which I'm sure might have confused the regulars. They are used to seeing a Heather & Tracey system! Anyway, the game was well attended, seemingly mostly by mates of the hosts and parents. The pitch was grassy, flat and looking in the best condition I've ever seen it look. The first half saw United in almost total control and they limited the opposition to just one early goal attempt. Thereafter they struggled to create any chances at all. So, it was a bit surprising that United could only score once in this period. The goal came on 8 minutes when the visiting keeper was left in no-mans-land after he rushed out to try and fail to stop a cross. The ball came to the unmarked scorer who had plenty of time to slot home. The second half was more productive from the hosts point of view and on 51 minutes someone called Milo added a second goal. His mazey running was causing the visitors all sorts of problems and after the third goal went in on 68 minutes, he scored a brilliant goal four minutes later when he slipped the ball one side of the keeper before running round the other side of him to collect it before running on to score. By now his pace was causing the Rovers right back big problems in trying to keep up with him. The by now amber nectar infused United fans near me advised him, "Take the hand break off!" A further goal five minutes later saw the end of the scoring and ultimately the end of a 'feel good' evening here.

### **Premier Division supported by Sportsform**

The 2020-21 season got underway just three weeks later than normal and saw the biggest win of the day go the way of Biggleswade FC Reserves with a 8-0 home win over Wilstead. ### **Bedfordshire Intermediate Cup 1st Round**

The biggest win of the day saw Bedford SA claim a 16-0 home win over The 61 FC Luton Reserves. Lucas Banton leading the way with a hat-trick and braces coming from Tom Andrews, Ollie Hughes, Ollie Raymond, Corey Rennie and Harry Stonebridge plus an own goal and single strikes from Michael Allen and Andrius Kencius to earn a second round trip to face Pines (Luton)

Also enjoying a big home romp were Cranfield United Reserves 8-3 over Pottun United Reserves. Martin Holland leading the way with a hat-trick, Patrick Lawrence adding a brace and single goals coming from Aaron Chaplin, Joseph Bygraves and Luke Gray to earn a home tie in round two against Sharnbrook who won 4-1 at Totternhoe Reserves. 2-0 up at the break with goals from James Watkinson and Bradley Raines the tie seemed settled when Issac Jones added a third seven minutes into the new half only for Ashley Denniss to reduce the arrears in the 68th minute until the visitors via Alec Horne made it 4-1 some 10 minutes from time.
