Registration Forms (covered under league rule 8)

All registrations are now conducted in Whole Game via each individual clubs Team Administrators and likewise all transfers.

With regard to transfers please note the league will not approve any transfers under the waived banner until the leaving club have notified the league they are happy for the transfer to go ahead.

Teamsheet Notes

Please note the names of your players must show both forenames and family names and the number of the shirt each player is going to wear in the game.

Far too many clubs in the past couple of seasons failed to display the correct number shirt against their players, please ensure this does not happen again in season 2021-22.

This season, all match officials are being instructed to refuse any sheet not completed in this manner.

Please note the exchange of team sheets should take place at least 15 minutes prior to kick off in presence of the Match Day Referee.

Result Sheets

Please note the deadline for your entry onto the Full Time Website is within 3 days of the match.

Thus the deadline is Tuesday Midnight following any given Saturday game. **(in the now digital world this has been brought forward 24 hours)**

For Monday games it would be the Thursday Midnight following and for Wednesday games it's the Saturday Midnight following.

Please ensure you spend a minute or so checking your entry as in each of every weekend last season at least one club and often up to six clubs had omitted to submit a referee mark.

Please note all result sheets are to be retained for possible inspection during the course of the season.

Match Day Reporting of Result (covered under league rule 11B)

The deadline for this to happen is within one hour of the match finishing. To clarify the actual time the league regards this to be three hours from the scheduled kick off time.

If 2pm Kick Off then its 5pm. If 2.30 pm Kick off then its 5.30pm. An additional 15 minutes will be allowed when involved in County Cup/ League Cup Tie that go to a penalty shoot-out.

Please remember if you are the away side in any County Cup Tie against opponents from outside our league then your club becomes responsible for reporting the result as above. Otherwise it's just the home side.

The preferred method is by text to 07779680269 – otherwise a phone call to the same number is quite acceptable – **please refrain from leaving messages on the answer phone**, if the line is busy then please wait a few moments and redial or send a text.

Please note this coming weekend is a Bedfordshire FA County Cup weekend and the requirement to reporting your result is listed above. This is in addition to reporting the result to the Bedfordshire FA.

Match Day information required for Press Reports etc.

When reporting the above result please provide the name of your goalscorers and any additional information such as sequence of the scoreline, time of goals, red cards, penalty misses/saves or anything unusual of note.

It would also very much assist if when you are the away team that the same information is supplied.

Wednesday 15th September 2021

In East Beds Charity Cup action Ickwell & Old Warden booked their place in the last four with a 4-1 away win at Kempston Athletic. Liam Brophy shooting them ahead in the 17th minute of this 35 minutes each way game before Athletic via a Harvey Eagle header levelled matters 15 minutes into the second period only to see Jaden Ford restored the visitors lead just four minutes later and with goals in the closing five minutes from Max Plunkett and Liam Brophy they ran out comfortable winners.

Joining them in the last four are Henlow who with goals from Sam Crow and Michael Coutts plus a Brandon Care penalty won 3-1 at FC Haynes whose lone reply came from Chris Clark.

Elsewhere, the annual Steve Loney Memorial Cup before a three figure plus crowd at the Hollow saw Potton United Reserves run out 5-0 home winners over Gamlingay.

Premier Division supported by Sportsform

The new leaders of the Premier Division supported by Sportsform league table are Queens Park Crescents following their 3-1 home victory over Crawley Green Reserves. Daniel Rasol, Antony Simms and Moses Olaleye all finding the back of the net against a lone reply from Rashaun Rattigan. Just goal difference behind them in second place are Caldecote who with two goals from Jack Bruce and a strike from Liam Beech won 3-0 away at AFC Kempston & Bedford College.

Taking up third spot also like the top two still 100% from their three outings are Stevington who with a brace of goals from Louis Green won 2-1 at Flitwick Town for whom Phil Matthews netted. Whilst in fourth spot and still unbeaten this season are Sharnbrook who were 7-0 home winners over Bedford Albion. James Barron leading the way with a hat-trick, Teddy Daniels hitting a brace to go alongside single goals for Josh Griggs and Harry Chinn.

Dropping down into fifth place but still unbeaten this season are AFC Oakley who were held to a 1-1 draw at Cranfield United. Ali Smith marking the visitors scoresheet and Courtney Boughton netting for United. Making up the top six and returning to winning ways are Elstow Abbey the 6-0 home winners over Biggleswade United Under23's. Wesley Lewis and Scott Alleyne both netting twice alongside single goals for Dan Mattin and Sheldon Washington.

Elsewhere, Shefford Town & Campton Reserves claimed their first victory of the season with a 3-2 home win over Riseley Sports. Ashley Ingham, Daniel Hammer and Harry Lovely all finding the back of the net against Sports replies via Lewis Donald and Sam Harrison.

Division One

Leading the way at the head of the Division One table are Stotfold Development who netted a 11-1 home victory over Pitstone & Ivinghoe Reserves despite only being 1-0 ahead at half-time. Kyle Watson netting four times, Kurtis Alleyne three times plus single goals coming from Jack Edwards, Billy Little, Alphic Marshall and Cullum Holmes against a lone reply from Jack Downes. Just goal difference behind them in second place are St Jospehs (Saturday) who won 8-1 at Flitwick Town Reserves.
