It was the newly crowned division two champions Elstow Abbey who went in front in the 12th minute when Eduardo L'Erario was on hand at the far post to slot home a low driven cross delivered in by Aaron Cavell. That's the way it stayed until 20 minutes from time when a Mark Endersby free kick was to deceive all and sundry in The Abbey penalty box and come back off the post into the path of Tom Dupuy who said thank you very much to make it 1-1.

With the Forde Park crowd of 110 now bracing itself for extra time, the winner arrived in time added on. Again Endersby was the instigator delivering a free kick into the Abbey penalty box where goalkeeper Darren Ayre could only stand and watch with horror after he spilled the ball

For second place Marsh Leys it was the sharing of the points in a 3-3 home draw with fourth place Clifton Reserves. Grant Williams, Jason Rose and Tom Buck netting the goals for the home side who are now unbeaten in their last seven home outings, whilst Tony Norman bagged a hat-trick for the visitors to take their unbeaten ways up to 10 games.

Preview for Saturday 28th April 2012

The Premier Division supported by Sportsform action curtails this weekend for the season with the staging of the last three games. At Renhold Playing Fields, hosts Renhold United receive a visit from the newly crowned champions Shefford Town & Campton who hit the road looking to end their league season with win number 15 on the bounce. Whilst at Crawley Road, bottom of the table Woburn look for just their second home win of the season when called upon by this season's silver medallists Caldecote who travel looking for their sixth win on the bounce.

The third game taking place at Hillgrounds, the venue at which hosts AFC Kempston Town & Bedford College need the full three points if they are to exchange places nine and 10 in the final league standings with their visitors Sharnbrook.

In Division One, the game of the day comes in shape of a title decider at Cople Playing Fields where Bedford Sports Athletic go head to head with Ickwell & Old Warden. If both clubs have as expected collected the full three points from their midweek outings then Ickwell & Old Warden will travel in the knowledge that any result other than a heavy defeat will see them crowned champions and leaving their hosts to collect the silver medals.

Down at the other end of the table depending on the result of the midweek clash between Meltis Albion and Kings AFC the second drop through the relegation trap door could still be open for either club to fall through. Meltis Albion going into home Miller Road action against Sandy, whilst at King George VI Playing Fields, Kings AFC receive a visit from FC Meppershall.

The fourth and final game in this division comes at Harvey Close where Caldecote Reserves host Lidlinton United Sports.

In Division Two there is a programme of six games. At Stonefields, AFC Turvey and Elstow Abbey take to field against each other just four days ahead of their clash in this seasons Jubilee Cup Final, but with the Abbey still unbeaten in the league this season I'm sure they will certainly want to retain that proud record.

Other action comes at Oakley Playing Fields where M & DH Oakley play their last game before merging with Oakley Sports for season 2012-13 when visited by bottom of the table Great Barford. Whilst at Rectory Road, Shefford Town & Campton Reserves go for win number six on the bounce when called upon by a Potton United Reserves side who are now unbeaten in their last five away outings.

Mowsbury Park is the venue for two other games where Marabese Ceramics play hosts to Sundon Park Rangers and Queens Park Crescents receive a visit from Co-op Sports. The sixth and final fixture being at The Luton Regional Sports Centre where Stopsley Park look to end a run of three straight home defeats against the visiting Bromham United who will arrive winners of their last three away outings.

With all the issues already settled in division three the programme of four games is just a matter of playing for pride. At Crawley Road, league champions Cranfield United Reserves will look to wave goodbye to division three football with a victory over bottom of the table Dunton Reserves. Whilst at Wrest Park, Sundon Park Rangers Colts will seek to extend their unbeaten league ways to five games when called upon by a Potton Town side that has lost its last five away outings.

Over at Hillgrounds, Royal Oak Kempston will look to repair a record of nine games without a home win when visited by Stevington and in Mowsbury Park, Goldington now losers of their last two home outings host Riseley Sports in a game that could decide who end the season above each other in the league standings.

In Division Four there is a scheduled programme of six games. However, one of those games is Caldecote A v Bedford Park Rangers and should The Rangers have not claimed the league crown in midweek then in view of their participation in The Watson Shield Final against Goldington the previous evening this game could be delayed until Monday 30th April. For Marsh Leys who at the time of writing could yet steal the title from The Rangers its home Cutler Hammer action against Dinamo Flitwick who will arrive having lost their last five away outings. Whilst should Thurleigh have ended The Leys title hopes in their midweek clash then they could still yet claim second spot with the right result when they travel to face Wootton Village at their Playing Field headquarters.

Other action comes at Digswell Playing Fields, the venue at which Shefford Town & Campton A now without a win from their last four outings host second from bottom of the table Goldington Hammers who journey having lost their last four away outings.
