The Bedfordshire County Football League is pleased to announce that an agreement has been reached with HBC Logistics for them to continue as the league's mainline sponsor for season 2025-26.

Registration Forms (covered under league rule18)

All registrations are now conducted in each club's club portal and their individual club's Team Administrators and likewise all transfers. (clubs.the fa.com)

Clubs are advised when making new registrations they search for the player by name and date of birth only.

The golden rule of making registrations is that if you know this player has played any previous competition football then he will already have a fan. If you cannot find him , then don't open a new fan, seek help to avoid the risk of making a duplicate registration and running the risk of a possible breach of league rules.

With regard to transfers please note the league will not approve any transfers under the waived banner until the leaving club has notified the league they are happy for the transfer to go ahead.

All clubs are advised/requested to check and ensure all registrations made have transferred correctly across from your clubs portal into Full Time.

Full Time Available Players List

Clubs are reminded of the note that appears on your match day available players list which reads. " Players above are registered with the competition on the above date

of this game. These may include players who are cup tied, or otherwise not eligible to play because they are under suspension- clubs should check with their County FA or on the Whole Game system for details of current suspensions.”

It is the clubs 100% total responsibility to ensure they do not play players who are serving a FA suspension and the league's recommendation they visit the Club Portal system prior to each game to check for any suspensions in place at any given date.

Teamsheet Notes (covered under league rule 21A)

Please note the names of your players must show both forenames and family names and the number of the shirt each player is going to wear in the game. **All clubs should ensure the player's name listed corresponds 100% with that by which he is registered.**

Far too many clubs in the past couple of seasons failed to display the correct number shirt against their players, please ensure this does not happen again in season 2025-26.

This season, all match officials are being instructed to refuse any sheet not completed in this manner.

Please note the exchange of team sheets should take place at least 15 minutes prior to kick off in presence of the Match Day Referee.

In past seasons several referee's are reporting that your exchanged team sheets are not being completed in Block Letters and not including details of your club officials in the technical area. Your failure to do so could well cause a delay to the start of the game and your club being reported for a late kick off.

Result Sheets (covered under league rule 21C)

Please note the deadline for your entry onto the Full Time Website is within 3 days of the match.

Thus the deadline is Tuesday Midnight following any given Saturday game.

For Monday games it would be the Thursday Midnight following and for Wednesday games it's the Saturday Midnight following.

Please ensure you spend a minute or so checking your entry as in each of every weekend last season at least one club and often up to six clubs had omitted to submit a referee mark or list their goalscorers/ red cards .

Please ensure all team sheets are retained for possible inspection during the course of the season.

Match Day Reporting of Result (covered under league rule 21B)

In the passing of a rule change at the 2024 AGM **home clubs only** are now required to submit the result of each competition match within 75 minutes of the end of the

match in response to an SMS text prompt. Failure to comply will incur a fine in accordance with the fines tariff.

To clarify matters the following deadlines will be applied.

2.00pm Kick Off. 5.15pm deadline.

2.30pm Kick Off. 5.45pm deadline.

6.15pm Kick Off. 9.30pm deadline

7.30pm Kick off. 10.45pm deadline.

This being based on 90 minutes play, 15 minutes half-time, plus another 90 minutes, being the 75 minutes from the end of the game and an additional 15 minutes to allow for late kick offs and time added on etc.

Please note an addition 15 minutes will be added to these deadlines for cup games that go to a penalty shoot-out.

Match Day information required for Press Reports etc.

It is still the league's intention to produce a Weekly News Bulletin and to this effect would ask /request all teams text their goal scorers and other facts of interest to Peter Francis on 0779680269 either on match day or previous to loading your Full Time Result sheet in the hope publication can be made sooner rather than later in the week that follows.

Postponed Games under League Rules 20E (III) and 23D

All Home clubs are reminded of the requirements under league rule 20E (iii) and 23D that in the event of any fixture being postponed, due to their ground being unfit or not available should their opponents or a neutral ground be available then it is mandatory to switch the venue of the game in question.

Premier Division supported by Sportsform

Under the floodlights at Hitchin Road the 2025-26 league season got underway where hosts Shefford Town & Campton were beaten 2-0 by the visiting Elstow Abbey. Following a goalless first period the game explored into action during the last 20 minutes, The starting point came on 71 minutes when the home side were reduced to 10 players following a red card for Jake Lorient. and within 60 seconds Glenn Tumulty had shot the Abbey into the lead with a strike that needed the help of a post to land into the back of the net. Their victory and the three points sealed when seven minutes later Steve Gentle headed home goal number two.

Saturday 6th September 2025

Defending champions AFC Oakley required a goal deep into time added on to salvage a point from a 5-5 draw at Biggleswade FC Reserves all after being 3-0 up after 43 minutes of play. Their opening goal came via an own goal just seven minutes into the contest or from the claiming Joseph McDonagh before goals from Chisom Amadi (20mins) and Teddy Daniels took them three goals clear. The home fightback begun when Harry Pyke reduced the arrears in time added on in the opening half before strikes from Fraelis Miemablo (50mins) and Michael Allen (55mins) saw the game all square with 35 minutes left to play. It was the visitors who were to regain their lead when Amadi netted his second of the afternoon on 67 minutes but this scoreline remained the same only a further 11 minutes until man of the match Pearce made it 4-4 direct from a free kick then four minutes later he converted a successful penalty to place his side in the front for the first time in the contest. The drama however was far from over with home player Raf Miles seeing red in the 87th minute before up popped Amadi to claim his hat-trick and earn the champions a share of the points in time added on.

Last season's silver medallist Marston Shelton Rovers opened their season with a 4-2 home victory over Wootton Blue Cross, Jamie Cerminara led the way with a brace and was joined on the home scoresheet by Luke Clifford and Charlie Cullen against a brace in reply from Noah Marsh. Whilst the top scorers of the day were Cranfield United Reserves who went nap with a 5-0 home victory over Totternhoe Reserves. Omojiseolwa Bankole led the way with a brace once of which came from the penalty spot, whilst goals also came from Jordan Conway, Edas Razanaliskas and another from the penalty spot from James Elkington.

The lone away victory of the afternoon belonged to Riseley Sports when goals from James Cooke and Freddie Spavins took them to the full three points at Flitwick Town whose lone reply came from Daniel Ruddick.

For the two newly promoted clubs it was the same outcome being a 1-1 draw. Ben Whalley on the mark for Harlington Juniors in their home encounter with Queens Park Crescents whose reply came via David Melseaux. Whilst Callum Frater netted

the Stopsley United goal away at Caldecote whose home strike came from Kyle Davis.

Division One

For goals you needed to be at the Baldock Victoria (new name for Buffs FC) v Thurleigh game which ended 6-5 in favour of the home side, Elliot Flynn with a brace plus strikes from Karl Safee, Jack Bendon , Rio Biral and George Farrell marked the Victoria scoresheet against replies via Ed Hatfield-Shaw twice plus Tom Burnage, Josh Marshall and Joe Frensham marked the visitors scoresheet. Whilst the biggest winners of the afternoon were Bedford Albion in winning 6-1 at Bletchley Scot. Nathan France hit the back of the net four times alongside single strikes from Shane Cox and Thomas Davies. The lone home reply coming from Nathan Perkins..

There were also away wins for both Lea Sports PSG and FC Haynes. The PSG with a hat-trick from Mark Davies and a single strike from Jack Stevens winning 4-0 at Wootton Blue Cross Reserves. A brace of goals from Etan Potts plus a successful penalty fired in by Harvey Holland saw AFC Oakley Development to a 3-0 home victory over Harlington Juniors Reserves. Whilst Blunham were thanks to goals from Elthan Ellis and Max Smalley 2-1 home winners over local rivals Caldecote Reserves whose lone reply came from James Tubridy.

The lone stalemate of the afternoon saw LU Donz drawing 3-3 at home with Clifton. Ali Mohiyaldeen with a brace plus David Byass on their scoresheet and Alister Moatt twice and Tony Gibbs once replying for the visitors.

Whilst newly promoted Kempston Athletic opened their season with a 2-1 home victory over

Green End Rovers thanks to goals from Ellis Sharp and Noah Biswell against a lone reply from Max Natola.

Division Three

The biggest win of the day went to Stopsley United Reserves with their 6-1 home victory over Caldecote A. Omar Leo and Owen Imprey with braces plus goals from Ryan Weedon and Milan Panchal doing the damage, against a lone reply from Luca Framcesca for the visitors. Whilst next best were LU Donz Development who were 5-0 home winners over Turvey where a brace from Ryan Newins and goals from Demario Legister, Cleopas Makaza and Ryan Wilkins brought up the Donz nap hand.

Also winning on home soil were Wilstead 4-2 over Flitwick Town A . Colin Marshall with a brace plus goals from Jude Thompson and Sam Ward doing the damage against Town replies from Garath Fossey and Clayton Hunt.

Whilst home strikes from Michael Michalski and Ricky Stephens could not save Bedford Albion Development going down on home soil to Elstow Abbey Reserves.
