Conculsion of the 2020-21 Season

With the 2020-21 league season declared null and void the Bedfordshire County Football League season 2020-21 will conclude with the staging of four supplementary cup competitions plus the Bedfordshire FA will continue this seasons Intermediate and Junior Cups which have now reached the Semi-Final stage.

Supplementary Cup Rules to note include.

Player Qualification League Rule 18A modified to read.

A player is one who, being in all other respects eligible, is a Registered Playing Member of the club he wishes to represent on 4th March 2021. No additional players may be registered by the club or transferred in from another club after this date.

A player shall not be eligible to play for a team in any match following the group stage unless he has played in the same Supplementary Group Stage for the team he wishes to represent.

Any registered player of a club eligible to play for a BCFL team may play in any match in the Group stage for that club.

Reporting of Results etc

The home club shall report the result of each Competition Match to the Press and Media Results Secretary within one hour of the end of the match. Failure to do so will incur a fine in accordance with the leagues fine Tariff.

For clarification. One hour after the end of the match is three hours from the scheduled kick off time. 2.30pm kick off. 5.30pm deadline. 6.15pm kick off. 9.15pm deadline. 7.30pm kick off. 10.30pm deadline.

Following which the match results notification shall be correctly completed onto Full Time within 3 days of the date of the game. Failure to do so will incur a fine in accordance with the leagues fine tariff.

For Clarification within 3 days is midnight on the following Wednesday for games played the previous Saturday. For games played on a Monday its midnight on the following Thursday. For games played on a Tuesday its midnight on the following Friday. For games played on a Wednesday its midnight on the following Saturday and for games played on a Thursday its midnight on the following Sunday.

Brian Buck Travellers Tales

78. (13,337) Saturday 3rd April 2021. Henlow 1 Sporting Lewsey Park 5 (Friendly Match) att 15 approx. So, after nearly three and a half months without watching live football, part three of my season started again today. So, if things go well this should signal the start of a 14 month run of continual football, especially as some local leagues are intending to play right up to the end of June this season. Technically speaking though this and many other games should have been played behind closed doors, according to Government guidelines. But with todays match taking place on a recreation ground this was almost impossible to enforce and while the game was going on people were going for walks and the playground was in full use. Actually, I was a bit annoyed as I was longing to have a go on the swings! Anyway, had someone come along to chuck me out then it would have been just as easy to watch the match from inside my car, parked in the road, right behind the goal! Overall it was good and refreshing to watch football again, as I don't think that I have ever had a break from it for so long since the 1960's. The players looked surprisingly fit though and it was the hosts who took the lead, on 15 minutes, when the ball was slotted in from close range. They should have doubled their lead within a minute and they would have done so had the chap who tapped the ball home on the line, left it alone. It was going in anyway but because he touched it, he was given offside. He had a go at the ref about this. Then three minutes later he was rightly sent off when he rather loudly called the ref an 'effing idiot' after another decision didn't go his way. I applaud the ref for doing this, even in a friendly match. Too many still take the soft option. When was the last time a Premiership ref sent off for someone doing the same thing? Anyway, the visitors soon took advantage of this, without really having to do anything, as a cross from the right was turned high into his own net by a Henlow defender and by half time Park were winning 3-1 with the third goal being a narrow angle direct free kick. The second half saw some exciting football from both sides and Henlow played well with ten men. But they still conceded again, on 65 and 67 minutes, although the last goal was obviously offside. Overall a decent game to restart my season.

79. (13,338) Friday 9th April 2021. Shefford Town & Campton 'A' 1 Brickhill Wanderers 1 (Bedfordshire County League Supplementary Cup 'C' Group D) att 10 approx. This match was brought forward a day because the hosts usual venue was unavailable until such time as Campton Parish Council could decide if football could be played on their recreation ground again this season. Since my last visit here, at the beginning of the season, much has been going on off the pitch, none of it directly affecting the football club, as work has commenced on building a new housing estate between the entry from Hitchin Road up to the football ground. So, it was a bit difficult to find the entrance tonight. Good news though is that most of the previously bumpy track to the ground has now been tarmacked, presumably by the builders. As for the game, the expected 7.30pm kick off never happened and we finally started half an hour later, with the reason given being that the visitors had come a long way (from Bedford!) to start any earlier! For the first half hour or so of the match Shefford were all over Brickhill and it seemed to be a question of just how many they would score. But as things turned out they had to settle for a 12th minute effort which the ball just trickled over the line with both the keeper and attacker almost trying to wrestle each other to get to it before it did. Had the keeper succeeded though he would have been sent off for at least two efforts to stop the attacker, with the second of these looking almost like an attempted debagging! Then for the remainder of the half Brickhill played very well, especially after they had their first shot of the game on 29 minutes. This coincided with Shefford having none for the remainder of the half. The second period was generally even and the game became good to watch. On 84 minutes equalised with a narrow angled shot from the edge of the area. But in sensing that they could now go on and win the match they got a tad over excited and on 90(+1) minutes one of their players picked up a second yellow card (and red) and two minutes later they had another player red carded for having the wrong kind of words with the ref!

80. (13,339) Saturday 10th April 2021. Ickwell & Old Warden 1 Eaton Park Rangers 2 (Bedfordshire County League Supplementary Cup 'B' Group A) att 15 approx. This was a cold day, but by the time the game started most of the earlier rain had ceased. Ickwell fooled me for a while by playing in a generally green kit whereas the visitors turned out in black and white stripes, a kit today's hosts have been known to use in the past. It was good to meet up once again with some of the old diehards who have been with the club for years and also to watch a couple of their veteran players still turning out for them. It was Eaton Park Rangers, from St Neots, who were largely the better side throughout, although when they took the lead on 39 minutes it was in effect an own goal, even though these days the man instigating the shot tends to get the credit. I spent a lot of the second half talking to a friend who lives adjacent to the ground, but I did see a visiting player get two yellows, for verbals, thus making it four red cards in the three games I'd seen since the restart. Despite this handicap they doubled their lead on 82 minutes before Ickwell popped in a consolation goal 5 minutes from time.
