Midweek Round-Up

Monday 17th April 2010

Division One

Caldecote Reserves were to maintain their challenge for this season's runners-up spot when running out 2-1 winners at AFC Kempston Town Reserves. Paul Gower shooting them ahead on the half-hour mark before Kai Griffiths-Shilton doubled the scoreline 10 minutes into the second period. The Town's reply was to arrive five minutes from time via Alec Russell.

For third place Marston Social, who trail Caldecote by six points but with three games in hand, it was a 4-3 win at Meltis Albion. Asa Garlick, Darren Ashpole and Michael Butler on target for The Albion being outgunned by strikes from Antony Deacon, Robin Platten, Darren Rowlett and Jack Constable.

Also still very much in the promotion race are Leighton United, who were to have their home fixture with Kempston Hammers Sports postponed after the visitors failed to raise a side.

Elsewhere, Sandy were to ending a four game losing away run with an 5-0 victory at Blunham Reserves. Sam Lewis, Ian Hammett and Mark Jennings netting in the opening half before the nap hand arrived via an own goal and a strike from Phil Beal.

The first half became even more one sided after Rovers got their second goal, scored by Franks, on 24 minutes. After this Rovers eased off trying to score themselves, safe in the knowledge that their opponents were unlikely to threaten them too much. However on 71 minutes they did score a third goal by way of Standish, whose shot took a massive deflection off an unnamed player, which is why he was credited with the goal. Bedfordshire FA Junior Cup Final Potton Wanderes 4, Renhold Village 2, Friday 23rd April 2010

For the first time since Potton Town won the trophy back in season 1912-13 will the name of Potton once again be engraved on the famous old trophy. The Wanderers before a Potton United Hollow crowd of 220 making up for their disappointment of losing last seasons final to Great Barford with a 4-2 victory over Renhold Village.

It was however, The Village who were to strike first blood, Carl Townsend being on hand to take full advantage of an awful error by Wanderers goalkeeper, James Billington, to slot his side ahead after just six minutes play.

The Wanderers were to level matters 21 minutes into the contest when from a pinpointed cross from James Hearson, Ricky Aris slotted home the equalizer. The Wanderers then taking the lead just five minutes before half-time, Danny Fox chipping the ball over a static Village backline into the path of Hearson who made light work of slotting it into the net past Village custodian David Lowe.
